6. Every person who, on 31st December in any year, possesses or has the charge or management of any apiary or hive of bees shall on or before 28th February in the following year report in writing to the Chief Agricultural Officer-

- (a) the number of apiaries in his charge or possession on 31st December of the previous year;
- (b) the number of hives in each such apiary;
- (c) the place and district in which each such apiary is situated.
